RE: **Support for LRB 1905/2 & 2143/2– Prohibiting the sale and use of aborted human fetal body parts**

Pro-Life Wisconsin strongly encourages you to sign on as a co-sponsor to legislation currently under circulation that would prohibit the sale and use of human fetal body parts. Fetal body part is defined to mean a cell, tissue, organ, or other part of an unborn child who is aborted by an induced abortion. The legislation bans persons from knowingly and for valuable consideration acquiring, receiving, or transferring a fetal body part. It also bans persons from knowingly providing, receiving, or using for experimentation a fetal body part.

There is documented evidence of the University of Wisconsin (UW)-Madison conducting research on human fetal brain and pancreatic tissue. A 2000 fetal brain cell study conducted by Su-Chun Zhang of the UW-Madison Department of Medical Sciences used immature neural cells from fetal human brain tissue of 15-20 gestation weeks “after elective termination of intrauterine pregnancies” to study neurological disorders including multiple sclerosis and Parkinson’s disease. The study acknowledged Dr. Dennis Christenson, a former Madison abortionist, for his “assistance in this project.”

A 1999 fetal pancreatic tissue study conducted by D.A. MacKenzie, H.W. Sollinger, and D A. Hullet of the UW-Madison Department of Surgery studied human fetal pancreases (HFP) as a potential source of transplantable islets for the treatment of advanced Type 1 diabetes. Human fetal pancreases between 13-20 weeks gestation were obtained “with informed maternal consent following elective abortions at local clinics.”

Concerning the abandoned 2009 UW Hospital & Clinics/ UW Medical Foundation / Meriter Hospital late-term abortion plan at the Madison Surgery Center, UW Hospital spokeswoman Lisa Brunette initially told the press that tissue from the abortions could be used by UW-Madison researchers but only after review by a faculty committee. Although the UW backed off that statement and insists that no such aborted fetal tissue research is currently being conducted, **the UW Madison’s history of such grisly research demands statutory safeguards.**

Federal law prohibits the interstate trafficking of human fetal body parts. Wisconsin’s intrastate commercial activity must have a similar prohibition so that we can guarantee the highest ethical standards of academic research and medical care in our state.
