I'm outraged by the latest round of inflammatory rhetoric against pro-choice leaders in our community, and this time it's not coming from anti-choice organizations or politicians.

The latest attack on a pro-choice community leader came from the *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel*.

Last week, the *Wisconsin State Journal* [ran an article](#) profiling Anne Nicol Gaylor and the Women's Medical Fund and their work to provide access to abortion to women who could not otherwise afford it.

In response to the profile, the *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel* published [an article](#) by anti-choice columnist Patrick McIlheran in which he refers to Gaylor as "Granny Blood Money paying to snuff people," and claims she "rounded up the scratch to kill 19,000 people."

The Women's Medical Fund has requested a retraction and removal of these statements as well as the removal of reader-posted comments referring to Gaylor as a "baby killer" and a "serial killer." But the *Journal Sentinel* has refused, claiming that such rhetoric is simply part of "the social dialogue about abortion" and contribute to "furthering a social debate about abortion."

[Demand higher standards of journalism by telling the *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel* that language such as "baby killer" and "Granny Blood Money" does nothing to further societal debate.](#)
